There are around 800 million accounts on Instagram, and not all of them are people and businesses. One type of account many in the Class of 2021 have taken to is fan accounts. From David Rozen's meme account to Synnove Mikkelsen's fan club page, fan accounts have become part of the culture of the sophomore class.
